Kangaroos are marsupials. Kangaroos have pointy faces and ears that go front to back. They have a very good sense of smell and very good eye sight. They eat hard grasses and then cough back up their food to soften it. They live in Australia and Papua New Guinea. They are the only large marsupial that hops. They jump 7m long and 3m high. They are great swimmers and can go a long way without water. (Dylan, year 1)

Kangaroos are vertebrates because they have a backbone. Kangaroos have pointy faces and ears that turn front to back. They have light brown fur on their skin because they're mammals. Kangaroos eat grass and leaves. Their babies drink milk. Kangaroos also drink water. Kangaroos are native to Australia. They can be seen everywhere. Because I see them everywhere!

Kangaroos can jump 7 metres long and 3 metres high. They fight to be a leader. Kangaroos can swim also they can't walk backwards. Kangaroos have really good sense of smell. They can stay without water for a long time. Kangaroo's babies are as small as a jelly bean and really hairless. They cough to soften their food. Kangaroos can only jump. (Chinatsu, year 2)

Kangaroos are marsupials. They eat grass and leaves. They have brown fur. They live in Australia. They move by jumping. They can't walk backwards. (Lucas, year 1)

Kangaroos are marsupials. Kangaroos have brown soft fur. They eat only grass and leaves and the babies drink milk and they live in Australia. Also kangaroos can jump really high. When they're in big groups it is called a mob. When the babies are born they are the size of a jelly bean and they have no fur. Also kangaroos have big
