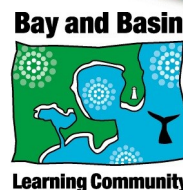

Students are encouraged to dress-up as their favourite character AND be able to talk about who they are.

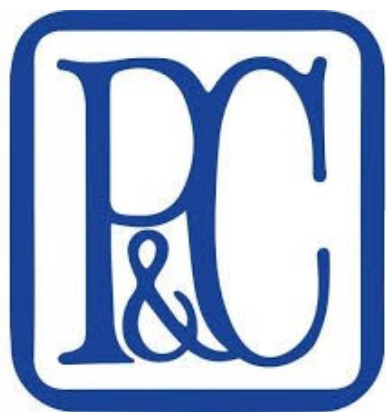
Questions that the students can answer for their oral presentation:

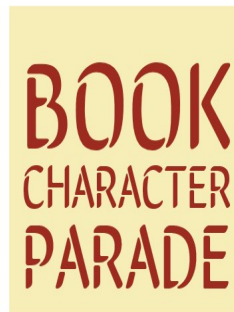


LOVE the LIBRARY

Girls Soccer Team

On Tuesday Huskisson played Sanctuary Point in Round 1 of the Girls PSSA Football (soccer) Knockout at the Huskisson Oval. Sanctuary Point won the toss and kicked off first, scoring a goal within the first two minutes of the game. Huskisson was not discouraged demonstrating, persistence. The following 15 minutes was a very tight struggle with every ball being keenly contested. Huskisson took control of the game, with exceptional passing and attacking with Co-captain Bridie Moore sending three balls flying into the back of Sanctuary Point's net. Red faced and tired the girls went back on pushing hard, Maddy broke away with great control of the ball, steadied herself and powered home the winning goal. All the girls put in an amazing effort and should be so proud of their achievement.

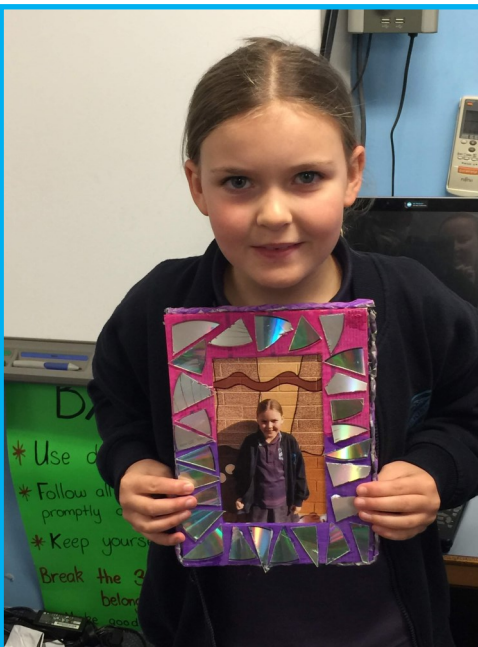
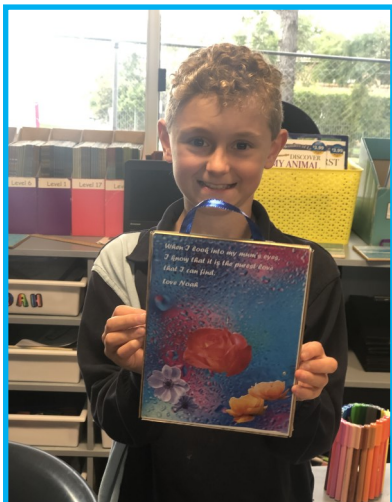
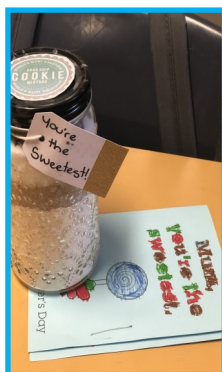
